During **Part 2** (September 15, 2020) Mr. Albright will walk you through topics related to program management and implementation, guided by the importance of a holistic asset management approach.

Then we will hear from Heather Himmelberger, who will provide examples from her broad experience helping plant operators implement asset management programs, namely:

- Creating and implementing effective standard operating procedures;
- Managing your WWTP to promote compliance and efficiency
 - Overall importance of asset management in compliance
 - Knowing what you have, what condition it's in, and how long it will last
 - Informing decision making
 - Tips for developing an effective preventive maintenance program
 - Finding technical assistance and resources
